About OSIRT

OSIRT is a “**browser on steroids**” that’s designed to aid law enforcement officials of all skill-levels to conduct Open Source Research on the Internet.

OSIRT styles itself on the look-and-feel of a normal web browser, but provides additional functionality such as **screen capturing** and **automated logging** of webpages visited. All evidential artefacts are automatically placed into a case container, along with the date and time they were obtained and a cryptographic hash for file verification.


OSIRT has been designed in collaboration with the **College of Policing**, where it is used as a centre piece for one of the College’s training courses.

Use by LEOs

OSIRT is also used by numerous law enforcement officials across the UK for live investigations; with many of OSIRT’s features based directly from law enforcement feedback and suggestions.

- Murder investigations

- Router log capturing
